Nursery:

Nursery is provided during evening services at the Heritage House
Birth to 3-year-olds.

Children's Activities:

Supervised, age-appropriate sessions are provided at times/locations shown in the schedule for
Children through age 11.

Youth Activities:

Besides scheduled sessions, the planned Youth camping experience entails supervised "bunkhouse" lodging and volunteer (kitchen duty/other) service projects for youth ages 12 & up. The cost for this program is \$40/student, which is a reduced cost for lodging, food, and activities, as long as students participate in the work program. Parents or other congregation representatives are responsible for any youth who elect not to participate in the structured activities, and those students are responsible to pay for their lodging and meals (see rates above).
